Vineyard description:

The 2007 Sonoma County Zinfandel comes from 3 vineyards. The first, Martorana Vineyard, is a 10-acre vineyard located on a hillside in the middle of a 1400-acre ranch on the north side of Lake Sonoma. The vines are an old clone called Dupratt. The second, Timber Crest Vineyards, is the home of the winery and is located on the famed eastside bench land of Dry Creek Valley. These 45 year old vines are the "old mother" clone planted on St. George rootstock. The third, Perotti Vineyard, is a one acre vineyard that yields 3 tons per year. Farmed by Bruce Perotti, this vineyard adds a beautiful fruit forward aroma with a distinctive acidity, giving this Zinfandel a long finish that keeps going.

Winemaker notes:

This is an elegant blend of three very unique Sonoma County vineyards. It is big and jammy with upfront aromas of black cherry and spice. The pallet shows hints of blackberry while the finish is of dark chocolate and nice acidity. This multi-dimensional wine shows big fruit, but is balanced by earth overtones and brambly spice. Great by itself, but pairs well with almost anything off the grill and shortbread with cream for dessert.
